• Get back to skiing's roots—the untracked backcountry, that is—with **PACIFIC CREST HELI-GUIDES**, the first heli-ski and snowboard operation to hit the Sierra Nevada in 40 years. What does this mean? Access to 100,000 acres of virgin powder, unnamed runs, and fresh bowls for the pioneering rider. pacificcrestheli.com.

Ever ridden a snowcat to dinner? Now you can, with **ALPINE MEADOWS' CHALET DINING EXPERIENCE**, which serves up four courses (think mushroom rib eye and pan-seared trout) in a midmountain lodge. Head to the roundhouse before dinner for a champagne toast under the stars. skialpine.com.
